### **CHILDREN IN WORSHIP**

We provide a "children's bulletin" each week with activities related to the regular readings. Books and coloring packets are also available to borrow during the service; please ask an usher for assistance. If a child becomes fussy or needs a break during the service, you are welcome to move into the Friendship Room (the parlor across from the sanctuary), which is equipped with speakers so that you can still hear the service. **Child care** is available for young children during the 9:00 a.m. service in the Care Room (lower level) staffed by volunteers. **Baby Changing Stations** are available in The Chapel School restrooms (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floors), the Men's Room located in the stairwell next to the Friendship Room, and the Ladies Room opposite the MultiPurpose Room on the lower level.

### **COLUMBARIUM**

*A sepulchral vault or any other structure with recesses in the walls to receive the ashes of the dead - American College Dictionary*

The Johnson Columbarium is located on the lawn along the north wall of the sanctuary. The five low walls in a garden-like setting are designed to receive a thousand urns of ashes. The beautiful setting allows ease of access for mourners to pay their respects to their loved ones. Interment is limited to VLC parishioners and members of their families. ### **REBATE PROGRAM**

VLC and The Chapel School Rebate Program - DeCicco Market Place, 505 New Rochelle Rd., Bronxville. When you check out at the register simply say, "Please put my total towards the Village Lutheran Church Rebate Program." Each month DeCicco's will write a check to the church. It doesn't cost us or the shopper anything.

### **RECYCLING PRACTICE**

Recycling bins are available throughout the facility for collection of paper, plastics, glass and metals. Westchester County requires that we separate recyclable materials from the regular garbage, following these guidelines: (1) Paper must be clean; include old bulletins, unwanted mail, scrap paper, magazines, newspaper and the like. Throw any soiled paper goods in the garbage. (2) Empty, rinse and recycle all plastics marked #1 through #7 (look for the number in a triangle), along with glass and metal. (3) NON-RECYCLABLE ITEMS should be thrown away. These include plastic bags, unmarked plastics (toys, tableware), plastic foam (coffee cups, packing materials), products with hazardous materials, and building materials.

Inkjet cartridges are also recycled for the sake of the environment. VLC receives a cash donation for each cartridge received. Collection boxes are located at the School Entrance and in the Friendship Room.

### **RESTROOMS**

Restrooms are available on each floor of the education building and a unisex bathroom is adjacent to the Reception Desk. In the church area, there is a men's room at the back, half-way down the south stairwell, and a women's room downstairs, opposite the Multi-Purpose Room. Baby-changing stations are included in all 1<sup>st</sup> & 2<sup>nd</sup> floor school bathrooms and in the church restrooms.

### **SENIORS**

This group offers monthly fellowship opportunities for men and women of retirement age. The seniors meet on the second Tuesday of each

month (except July and August) to socialize, enjoy a catered lunch and hear a guest speaker. Some months also feature an off-campus activity such as shopping in the Poconos. VLC members are welcome to bring non-member friends. Residents of Lohman Village (Wartburg, Mt. Vernon's Retirement Community) also regularly participate in these activities.

### **SUNDAY SCHOOL**

The mission of the VLC Sunday School is "to nurture the faith development of our children as they learn about God and His grace and love for them". We are "to make disciples of all nations, teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you" (Matt. 28:19-20). Our program on Sunday mornings is for children from age 3 through Grade 6. Classes run from September, the first Sunday after Labor Day, through June. Teens and adults who enjoy working with children are encouraged to serve as a team teacher or assistant.

#### Preschool (age 3) - Grade 2

Class is from 9:00 AM - 10:15 AM. During this time there is an opening worship, lesson and activities, and singing with the Cherub Choir (who sing about 5 times each year in Church).

#### Grades 3-6

Children participate in the 9:00 AM worship service and are dismissed after the Children's Message (at about 9:20 AM) for Sunday school. Their Sunday school classes meet until 10:15 AM.

All children are encouraged to participate in our Memory Work Program, which is to be done at home with parents. Selections include Bible verses, hymn verses, prayers and parts of Luther's Small Catechism. During the year, children also participate in a special Christmas service and other activities such as mission projects, making cards for shut-ins and celebrating baptismal birthdays.

There is also a Cradle Roll program for children, newborn to age 3. Birthday cards and devotional materials are mailed to the children and their parents. This program is for children baptized at the VLC and newborn to age 3 children joining our church after baptism.

VLC is located at 172 White Plains Road/Route 22 in the Village of Bronxville, Town of Eastchester, Westchester County, north of Mount Vernon and south of Scarsdale and Tuckahoe.

### *From New York City, New Jersey and Upstate New York:*

Take the New York State Thruway (Major Deegan Expressway/Route 87) to the Cross County Parkway. Go east to exit 8, Route 22/North Columbus Avenue. The church is located 1.4 miles north.

### *From Long Island*

Take the Hutchinson River Parkway (off the New England Thruway) north to exit 13, Cross County Parkway. Continue on the Cross County Parkway to Exit 8, Route 22/North Columbus Avenue. At the end of the ramp, turn left onto Route 22. The church is located 1.4 miles north.

### *From Connecticut*

Take the Merritt Parkway to the Hutchinson River Parkway south to Exit 18 W, Mill Road. At the end of the ramp, turn right onto Mill Road and continue 0.7 miles to Route 22/White Plains Road. Turn left onto White Plains Road. The church is located one mile south.
